What are Silostop® gravelbags?

Silostop® gravelbags are a very convenient tool to help seal silage bunkers and piles. Their filled weight and shape ensures that the cover is held in place while maintaining the perfect seal. Use of Silostop® results in minimal silage loss, improved animal intake and animal health.

All Silostop gravelbags come with the following items built in as standard: tie string, sealing flap, handle, rotation mark.

Fill with small diameter (1/4 to 3/8 inch) smooth stone. This allows for easy filling, water drainage, and long bag life.



For ultimate forage quality, we recommend combining Silostop® gravelbags with Silostop® silage covers.

Silostop gravelbags come in 2 versions.

Standard bag – use end to end on edges and seams, and in between for sealing and weight
